FROM THE PASTOR'S PC

Dear friends,

This is the last time I write to you in these pages.

For ten years I have been communicating with you nearly every week here in the bulletin; which means there have been probably anywhere from 400 to 500 of these letters in the archives.

Amazing to think of it: all those words!

As you know, I was asked unexpectedly last March by Bishop Murphy to accept a new charge, the pastorate of Saint Matthew's in Dix Hills. My own assumption had been that I would fill out my second six-year term in 2012; and if it were left up to me, to continue on as long as I could. A few people have asked me if I could have refused the Bishop's request. Technically, I could have insisted on filling out the remaining two years of this term to the end. However, then I would most likely have been moved anyway and not necessarily with the Bishop being as complimentary and considerate as he has been to me. However, to have insisted on supposed "rights" is not the way I have lived my priesthood for these past 32 years. Indeed, the reason I came here as the seventh pastor of Saint James was an equally unexpected phone call in April of 2000 by the then Bishop, James McHugh.

I have always felt uneasy with the business of "applying" for pastorates on a personal and spiritual level. While by no means saying that a Bishop's appointment is an act of the infallible *Magisterium* (it is, in fact, an administrative decision subject to human fallibility); the acceptance of such an appointment by a diocesan priest promised to "*obedience and respect*" can be accepted with a clear conscience. When Angelo Roncalli, better known as Pope Blessed John XXIII, was first appointed a Bishop, he chose as the episcopal motto which followed him all through his varied and eventful "career" the very traditional motto *Obedientia et Pax* (*Obedience and Peace*.) I can tell you there is a peace which flows from an intelligent and generous priestly obedience.

When I came here it was with a sense of liberation that I had not "applied for" Saint James and hence had not that nervous sense of having to "make a success" of something I'd lobbied for. (Sadly, there are priests who have been consumed with the business of such; and have too often come to grief over it: either in the getting of their desire; or the reluctance to abandon it.)

Whether or not my decade's pastorate among you has been a "success" I will leave to, as Saint Paul says, "another judge." I wonder in some way what the definition of "success" in the pastoral ministry might be in the 21st century. There are objective standards that can be used: administrative, financial, statistical and so forth. I knew a priest once who used to boast of the literal number of Communion hosts ordered in a year as if that were an indication of the holiness of the parish! However, we must be honest to admit that we in the Catholic Church are living through days in which all the relevant statistical and observable indices are not favorable, to say the least. When this parish was founded almost all the problems faced by pastors were ones of coping with vast and visible expansion and growth. Now, let us say, the problems are one of retrenchment.

This parish has had its share of these wider phenomena: we've had our brush with the priestly sexual abuse scandals of the past decade; the theological and spiritual divisions that still continue to divide the Church; and so forth; and an understandable frustration that one's hopes, plans, and ministry do not seem to garner the visible results one would wish.

However, the words of the Lord through the Prophet come as a reminder:

"My ways are not your ways!"

For these past ten years I have tried to do it "His way".

My judgments, decisions, words, and actions are indeed mine: subject to my weaknesses, limitations, and fallibility. I am reminded in the words of an old prayer that I have done some *things which I ought not to have done, and left undone those things I ought to have done*. Yet in all, I have done and said them in the belief that they were what the Lord wanted, and what would be for our good; if not always what we wanted.

I have shared whatever personal gifts I have with you as pastor, priest, preacher, and leader, and friend. The kindness, support, generosity, respect, and yes, affection so many of you have shown me in so many ways is a precious gift. I have experienced many milestones here both joyous and sad: two priestly anniversaries, a Parish Golden Jubilee, eight Carnivals, 10 Liturgical Years, as well as the death of my mother. In all these, you (priests, deacons, Parish Staff, Trustees, advisors, volunteers, and faithful men and women) have been a joy and a support; of which I am unworthy. I am deeply grateful. I also think of some who in the space of these ten years are no longer among us in the earthly parish; but who, please God, have received the reward of their goodness to this Catholic community and to me personally.

In that spirit, I take my leave and become the pastor of "other sheep". In the days and years to come, what I have seen and learned here amongst you will benefit others in ways that they and you may never know.

I know that you will extend to Father John Derasmo, your next pastor, the same support and kindness you have shown me. I wish him every blessing in this community of faith under the patronage of our holy Apostle Saint James, the Saint of the pilgrim.

And so, as I have done for a decade, I wish you:

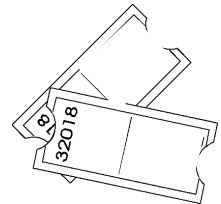

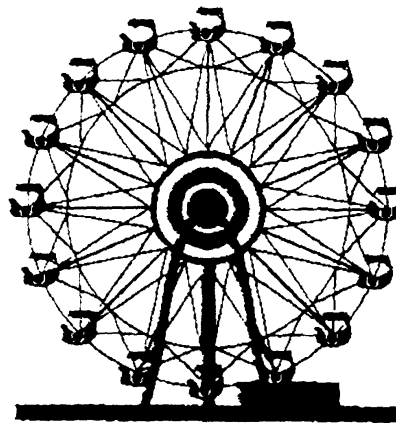
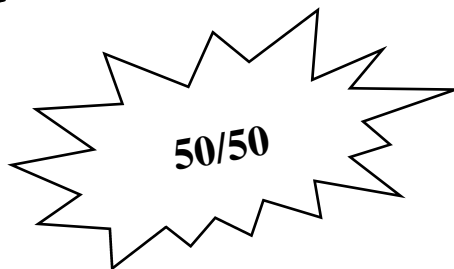
